



# Workplace Giving

## What is workplace giving?

Workplace giving is a simple and effective way for you to regularly donate to VOCAL Inc NSW through automated payroll deductions. You pledge a nominated amount (eg. \$2, \$5 or \$10) and that amount is sent directly to our Charity account each pay.

## What is the benefit to you?

Workplace giving is a 'pre-tax' programme, meaning you receive the benefit of an immediate tax deduction from your wage. Be assured that your donation is received free of admin fees.

**Workplace giving is particularly handy for people who would like to contribute to the community but do not wish, or are unable, to take a more active role.**

## Simple to set up

Workplace Giving does not require a lot of time or effort from you. We have information ready for your payroll officer, all you need to do is to select a small amount to donate each pay.

## How does workplace giving help VOCAL?

Financial assistance is vital to our charity work in advocating and lobbying for victims' rights. Through workplace giving, we are able to plan, budget, reach more victim of crime and provide direct feedback to policy makers and the NSW Attorney General's Department.

With an increasing workload for our staff and board members, time for fundraising is a luxury we do not often have. Workplace Giving allows VOCAL to receive regular and stable funding.

## WHAT HAPPENS AT TAX TIME?

VOCAL will keep a record of your donations across the year and provide you with a statement of the total donation.

In this pre-tax workplace giving system you will have already received the tax benefit throughout the year for your donation. Therefore you only need to record the amount on your tax return, rather than keeping receipts and claiming for that amount. It's a simple and effective way to give.
